Pre-K and younger students are welcome to compete as Kindergarteners in their respective sections. Players are required to have a US Chess Federation membership (www.uschess.org to join) to compete in a rated tournament. Top rated scholastic players invited to compete in the State Scholastic Championship are also required to have a GCA membership to play (www.georgiachess.org to join).

No training required:

Advance training required (to be scheduled by the Chief Tournament Director):

- Informatics – use the chess software program WinTD to compile and enter players, pairings, and results
- Tournament Director – assist in the tournament room to verify game results, answer questions, and resolve problems from the players. Chess knowledge and playing experience required. Certification is required for rated events.
